Introducing Eisenhower's
Newest Four-Legged Volunteer

After the passing of Canine Ambassador "Lucky", Richard Waxman (Lucky's owner and Founder of "Paws & Hearts") had no intention of finding a replacement. However, during Thanksgiving weekend 2011, Richard visited a two-day pet adoption event in Rancho Mirage. As he passed cage after



cage trying hard not to look, he noticed a tiny, eight-month-old puppy whose eyes immediately caught his attention. After a futile attempt to say, "No", Richard gave in and Maddie made her way into his life and into the Eisenhower family.

In March, Richard took Maddie on her first visit to the hospital with her partner Scruffy, (Lucky's former assistant.) Rambunctious and frisky at home, he wanted to see if Maddie could adapt to the surroundings of a hospital. "She was nothing like the dog she is at home," says Richard. "It was as if she had visited Eisenhower for years. She was gentle from the start, taking Scruffy's lead, watching what to do and was incredible with the patients and staff."

As for Scruffy, Richard says, "He is thrilled to reprise his role as *co-star*. He just loves to sit in the secondary position and let little Maddie do all the kissing stuff."

Our volunteer teams visit their assigned facility each and every week and part of their commitment is to email into our office a weekly report, complete with their visitation story. Some day, these stories along with photographs will be turned into a book because the stories are heart-warming and the patients/clients we visit truly treasure their weekly visit.

<u>California Nursing & Rehabilitation</u> Jonathan & "Zoe": We were a little early and many of the residents were in the activity room. They were close to the end of the session so we waited and joined them when they were finished. "Zoe" was wheeled around on one of the chairs so she could visit most of them and she really enjoyed the whole episode. We saw a new resident that was in for dialysis treatment. She was blind and had to visualize "Zoe" with her hands-she was so happy with the visit. "Zoe" laid down next to her so she could get a good picture in her mind. She was going to be there twice a week for treatments and wants to make sure we find her next Tuesday! *Lovely, lovely story of Animal Assisted Therapy at its very best!*

<u>Eisenhower, Lucy Curci Cancer Center</u> Jean & "Buffy": I made it to Lucy Curci through the heat and hot pavement, but was relieved when we got inside the building. I tried to run fast but my Mom cannot run or walk too fast. I had a good visit as every one was glad to see me! I got to run and play with an older man which was great fun! My Mom told everyone we will continue to visit them on Thursday's as long as it will not be too hot on my paws. I am too big and too heavy to be carried! "*Buffy*"

<u>Santa Fe Assisted Living Facility, Yucca Valley</u> Cathy & "Pedro": We visited on Saturday and "Pedro" gets better each time! He and Joey, one of the clients dogs are getting to know each other. Had a good visit in the Alzheimer's section—everyone just loved "Pedro", he did his tricks for the residents and is getting to know them all!

<u>Desert Cove</u> Cathy & "Zoey": This was "Zoey's" first visit and the first visit at this new *boutique assisted living* facility in Indio. Upon entering one of the residents came up to "Zoey" and his eyes just lit up. He told us that he had a Standard Poodle for 17 years. As we were leaving he told me to be sure to keep her because she was really special!

"Zoey" visited another man in his room. Upon entering, the staff person told him he had a visitor. He said he was really sick, but then he saw "Zoey" and she put her front paws on the bed and this brought a big smile to the residents face. "Zoey" kissed his hand and arm, and the resident talked to her. He told me to be sure and come back next week and visit! *Again, Animal Assisted Therapy working wonders!*

Eisenhower Medical Center Richard, "Scruffy" & "Maddie": It has been almost 3 months since "Maddie" started going on visits and she is quite the champ. It is almost as if dear "Lucky's" soul is in her little body. Many lovely rooms today, but the best was one 5-year old boy who just lit right up when the guys came into his room. As I put the dogs on the bed the little boy began asking lots of questions about the dogs. "Scruffy" did his usual thing of kissing the boys hand, and "Maddie", instead of standing up kissing, sensed the boy wasn't feeling good and decided to snuggle very gently along his side and allowed him to stroke her. The mother was most appreciative of the visit!
