What it takes to be a Great Canine Ambassador

At "Paws & Hearts" we are always on the look-out for amazing dogs that have what it takes to become a great therapy dog. Many dogs pass the temperament test very easily, others don't.

When you are assessing your dog's temperament in the hopes that he or she could become a visiting therapy dog, please consider the following:

- How friendly is my dog with total strangers?
- How well does my dog do in different settings, places that he or she doesn't go all the time?
 - Does my dog enjoy being petted and massaged?
- When company comes to visit, does my dog think the company has come to see him or her? Are there suddenly toys brought out in the hopes that the company will start to play? Will my dog engage the company and not get bored easily?
 - Does my dog listen to my verbal commands without hesitation?

These are qualities we look for when assessing your pooch!

Keep in mind, you and your dog will be going from room to room visiting patient after patient in bed. Your dog will be at the side of the bed, or on the bed visiting with the patients and must be engaging at all times. He and Maddie visited, and even Bingo had a chance to get to know Nolan.

It is getting to know patients like Nolan that make this kind of work so very rewarding!
